TRAINING AIRCRAFT INCIDENT AT SULTAN ABDUL AZIZ SHAH AIRPORT, SUBANG

PUTRAJAYA - The Civil Aviation Authority of Malaysia (CAAM) confirms an incident involving a Piper PA-28-181 aircraft, registration number 9M-SKR on a training flight at Sultan Abdul Aziz Shah Airport, Subang, Selangor on Tuesday, 18 November 2025 at 12.52 p.m. The aircraft, operated by Malaysian Flying Academy Sdn. Bhd. (MFA), suffered a nosewheel collapse upon touchdown.

There was one pilot on board and is reported safe. The runway is temporarily closed and a safety investigation will be conducted by the Air Accident Investigation Bureau (AAIB) under the Ministry of Transport Malaysia in accordance with Part XXVI Civil Aviation Regulations 2016.
